Francois served for many years as the European regional editor until he and I became co-editors in chief in July 2017 with the publication of volume 48 no. 2.

During our joint tenure, Francois did the bulk of the editorial work along with soliciting papers from his vast network of highly respected colleagues. Recently, he decided to retire from the journal and has become Editor Emeritus.
